  - Breanne has continued on this year in her capacity as Secretary, providing a valuable service in keeping the minutes for both the School Council and the Fundraising Society.
- Wellness Committee, Candice Abraham
  - This position was vacant for the majority of the year and was filled at the May 13, 2023 meeting when Candice was voted in.
- o Communications Officer, Sara Gruninger
  - This position was vacant for the year, as Sara needed to resign her
    position at the beginning of the year due to personal reasons. Thankfully,
    Christa Gawron, the schools Business Manager graciously updated the
    schools Facebook page for all of the school events and activities.

## 2. Meetings

- The Davidson Creek Elementary School Council operating procedures require a minimum of five meetings to be held at the school. There is no set date or time these meetings are to be held. #### 3. New Administration

There were many changes at the school this year including changes to the administration. The previous Principal, Kaye Schindeler retired and the Assistant Principal, Murray Howell took a position with Pine Street. We were thrilled to welcome Helen Hewitt as the new Principal coming to us from Ardrossan and Kyla Harding, Assistant Principal also from Ardrossan. Right from the begging they dug right into DCE culture directing traffic on the first day of school in their pink vests. They have certainly not disappointed and held true to Mrs. Hewitt's first word that it would 'be a wonderful year, full of adventure, friendships and

much learning!' Also new to the administration this year is our school Counsellor, Dina Deuzeman.

### 4. Communication

- Communication with the parents and staff was greatly improved this school year under the new administration. Outside of School Messenger or email, the school is also communicating by Facebook, Twitter and the Mustang Memo.
- Our Facebook numbers for the DCE parents group grew from 516 to 549 members. Currently this page is administered by a parent of a current student and is not managed by the school or school council. The page origin was prior to the opening of the school and was a way for parents to connect on the building progress of the school and building relationships ahead of time. Discussions will be held later in this meeting to discuss if this page should continue to be managed by outside sources or if it should fall under the school council's administration.
- Our Twitter account @DavidsonCreek currently has 221 followers and is managed by the school.
- Mustang Memo
  - The Mustang Memo was established by the new administration and parents received their first edition on August 29, 2022. Parents receive the memo through email and Facebook, as well as posted on the school's website. It has been a great tool to keep parents up to date on a weekly basis on the ongoings at the school, as well as important information about our division and tools and resources to help parents navigate our children's daily lives. The memo follows the same structure and is posted and sent weekly on Fridays. Having this consistent messaging from the school allows parents to keep up to date on import issues and topics. The format is:
    - Message from the Principal and Vice-Principal general message or update on something new or exciting that's happened at the school. Opportunity to highlight events. With the memo online, it also provides the opportunity to share videos and pictures.
    - Table of Contents:
      - Week at a Glance: provides an overview of the upcoming events for the week i.e.: hot lunches, early dismissal, lunch activities, field trips, etc.
      - Action: these are action items needing attention, anything from downloading the school calendar to filling out parent information on the school portal, etc.

- Opportunity: opportunities for parents to engage with, anything from school council meetings, events at the school, etc.
- Information: general information, anything from morning drop off, links to school information such as the school handbook, EIPS notifications. This section also includes a series specifically for parents:
- Parents Make the Difference series. Each week posts are made on interesting articles with tips to support the important work parents do at home.
